Greetings Bonneville Family and Friends,

On Tuesday night, the board approved Superintendent Madden's phased plan for the return of our elementary students beginning January 25th. The board will be revisiting this issue during their first meeting in December. Over the next few weeks, Teaching and Learning will be involved with helping us collect data from our faculty, staff, and families.

There are still many questions and concerns about this plan as well as with any potential alternative entry one. Recognizing that we all have roles and responsibilities in our students' education as well as everyone's safety, we must work through this together. Further, there are a lot of data and with that a lot of different views and feelings about it.

I am still getting clarification and will have more information from the Board as well as from my supervisors in the upcoming days. As always, I will answer any questions that I have clear information on. I am working with all stakeholders on this and I will continue to have a parent meeting on Zoom on Wednesday at 6:00 P.M, the 2nd of December.

In the meantime, we are still in remote learning while bringing in some small groups of up to 7 students at a time. Teachers have communicated this with you already and these groups look different in the different grade levels.

With all this, I would just like to reiterate that this has been so hard on everyone: students, teachers, parents, and staff. It is about the kids, but it is really about all of us, too. I sincerely appreciate how everyone has been willing to work together.

Here are a few more items I would like to add in as well. We are coming up on Thanksgiving break and Wednesday is a digital learning day. Work will be posted on Canvas for the students to complete that day but there will not be any Zoom or small group lessons that day. The building will still be open only for packet pick-up though from 7:00 am to 2:00 P.M.

Fun Things to do with Family

One of Salt Lake City's top attractions, [Utah's Hogle Zoo](#) is a 42-acre space located at the base of the Wasatch Mountain Range within Emigration Canyon. The zoo houses several diverse exhibits, each of which illustrates a unique ecosystem. The elephant encounter is a fascinating and expansive exhibit showcasing white rhinoceros and African elephants in several environments.

The Asian highlands exhibit features the Siberian lynx, Pallas' cats, snow leopards, Amur leopards, and Amur tigers. The Rocky Shores exhibit houses harbor seals, grizzly bears, polar bears, and sea lions. Meanwhile, the African Savannah exhibit introduces guests to African lions, zebras, ostriches, and finally, giraffes, who are housed in a separate area where guests are welcome to feed them.

- Student Masks- The intent of Inter-State Studios is to photograph all students without a mask. Students will be asked by a volunteer to remove their mask when it's their turn to be photographed. Inter-State photographers cannot require a student to remove their mask so please be sure that you have talked with your student about your wishes (mask or no-mask) prior to your arrival. If a student prefers, they will be photographed with their mask on.
- Social Distancing-The distance between the camera and a student is over 6 feet.
- Tape will be used to mark 6 feet apart for the student lines.
- Photographers are required to wear face coverings.
- Sanitation of Photo Equipment-Cameras, equipment and stools will be sanitized between each group.

Timeline for 2021-22 Open Enrollment

Prior to November 30, 2020

- Board designates school's status of Open or Closed for Early Open Enrollment

December 1, 2020 to February 19, 2021

- Early Open Enrollment Applications are submitted online.

February 20, 2021

- School administrators have access to submitted applications.

March 15, 2021

- Deadline for principals notify parents of currently enrolled students who will not be permitted continued enrollment for the coming year. This notice must be preceded by

due process and documented intervention attempts unless otherwise determined through a safe school hearing. Contact student services for support.

March 31, 2021

- Deadline for principals to notify parents of Early Open Enrollment application status.

April 15, 2021

- Deadline for parents to accept or decline Early Open Enrollment opportunities.

Schools may not develop "waiting lists" from Early Open Enrollment applications. The school choice system will automatically complete priority ranking and random selection.

Applications must be accepted or rejected by the March 31st deadline.

Students whose applications are rejected during the Early Open Enrollment may reapply for a Late Enrollment after April 1st.

Superintendent's Message:

November 19, 2020

Dear Salt Lake City School District community,

On Tuesday night, the Board of Education voted to offer an in-person option for our youngest learners beginning at the end of January. This will begin sometime the week of January 25 with students in pre-K, kindergarten, and 1st grade. We will expand to bring in students in 2nd through 6th grades after that. (Please note this will not include 6th graders who attend a middle school.)

Working closely with the Salt Lake County Health Department, we have examined the latest COVID-19 data for all the school districts in Salt Lake County. The data indicate that elementary school-aged students are contracting COVID-19 at similar rates across the county, regardless of whether they are currently attending school in person or online. There is no statistically significant difference in COVID-19 rates for elementary aged students in Salt Lake County, which tells us that even though COVID cases are rising in our community at large, the risk does not increase significantly for elementary students when they attend school in person. After consulting with pediatric epidemiology experts, our local health department, and my leadership team, I felt comfortable making this recommendation to our Board of Education.

Making a proposal to offer an in-person option is not something we took lightly. Please know that we make decisions with the best interests of students and employees – for both safety and educational opportunities – at heart. We will continue to monitor health department data, including to learn more about the impact this change may have on both children and adults.

Remote learning will continue to be an option for those who feel that is the right choice for their family, and district leaders will work closely with school leaders over the next several weeks to determine how to best structure these two learning options. I will continue to provide you with updates every Thursday as we approach the week of January 25, and we will have a dedicated page on our district website with information about this transition available soon. You will receive school level updates from your student's principal.

The virus is currently out of control in our communities, and we need your help to change that before the end of January. Now is the time to take personal responsibility for getting our community spread under control. Please wear your mask routinely, practice social distancing, and limit contact with people who do not live in your same household. The infection rate can change rapidly, and we all need to do our part to keep each other safe.

DIGITAL LEARNING DAY

Wednesday, November 25, 2020, is an asynchronous learning day for students. (Asynchronous learning means class will not be held live. Instead, the learning can happen on the student's own time and at the student's own pace.) Teachers will provide asynchronous lessons for students on this day, just as they do on Wednesdays during our regular week of remote instruction. Students will have at least four hours of asynchronous learning planned by their teacher(s). Elementary teachers should provide four hours of learning for students. Middle

school and high school teachers should provide approximately one hour per class period, based on the number of periods per day.

COVID-19 Parent Symptom Guide

Should your student come to school today?

Children who are sick should not go to school. **Parents are being asked to check their students for symptoms of Covid-19 every day before sending their student to school.** This quick assessment can help parents determine if their student should attend school or stay home and follow up with a healthcare professional.

Symptoms

Does your child have any of these symptoms?

- Fever or temperature of 100.4° F (38° C) or higher. If you do not have a thermometer, check your child’s skin to see if it feels warm or is red, or ask if they have chills or are sweaty.
- Cough – If your child normally has a cough because of allergies or asthma, is this cough different than normal?
- Shortness of breath
- Muscle aches or pains not explained by exercise or activity
- Decrease in sense of smell or taste
- New runny nose
- Sore throat
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Yes, my child has at least one of those symptoms

Your child should isolate at home, and not go to school until they have seen a healthcare provider.

Your child may need to get tested for COVID-19.

Students may return to school when:

- At least 10 days has passed since the first symptom appeared, symptoms have improved, and there has been no fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication. OR
- Students have a note from a healthcare professional containing another diagnosis. OR
- Students have a negative COVID-19 test.

No, my child is sick, but does not have any of the symptoms listed above.

Keep children home until they have been symptom free for 24 hours.
See a doctor right away, if your child does not seem to be getting better or is getting worse.
